Two Killed, Fourteen Hurt In Wreck, Virginian R. R. Near Bluefield, Yesterday

BLUEFIELD, May 24.—Two were killed and 14 injured today when two Virginian railway train tender crashed at Ingleside, 30 miles east of Bluefield.

E. G. Aldrich, of Boone, Va., and his fireman, F. M. O'Neal, of Park, Va., members of the first engine of passenger train No. 3, were scalded to death as their engine climbed to the top of the electric locomotive that drew the freight train.

Twelve passengers on train No. 3, enroute from Boone to Huntington, were injured. Officials of the road declared early tonight that none of the passengers were seriously hurt.

Doctors and nurses from two Princeton hospitals left immediately for the scene of the wreck. The collision occurred near the opening of a tunnel just west of Ingleside.

The passenger train was scalded by the steam locomotive which had to face with the long coal train drawn by a single electric motor.

Virginia railway officials at Princeton early tonight expressed the opinion that the crew of the ill-fated passenger train were not at fault.

At the point where the wreck occurred the Virginia line passes over the Norfolk and Western railway. A small electric railroad station just east of Ingleside.
