ALLIED AIR FORCE HEADS

Nazi Strongpoints Blasted By Large Air Fleet

THOUSANDS OF BOMBER PLANES SUPPORT VASSAL STATES

Take Advantage of Improving Weather to Strike at German Troop Concentrations, Airports, Rail Centers and Gun Posts Behind Front

By WALTER CRONKITE London, June 10.—(UP)—Thousands of American and British warplanes went to the support of Allied invasion armies in France today, taking advantage of improving weather to strike at German troop concentrations, airports, rail centers and gun posts behind the Normandy front.

A 1,000-plane fleet of Flying Fortresses, Liberators, Mustangs, Thunderbolts and Lightnings bombed and gunned many airfields in Brittany and Normandy. Nazi strong points near the battlefield, and targets of every variety.

ALLIES CAPTURE TUSCANIA, 50 MILES NORTH OF ROME

Inability of the Hard Hit German 14th Army to Make a Stand, Lays Open the Nazi Flank to Attack by the Eighth Army
